

Hosting outdoor shows on private properties around Sudbury

SAFETY MEASURES FOR AUDIENCES OF ALL AGES

General provisions

Prior to the show, Carrefour francophone and TNO will share their Safety Measures with audience members via their respective websites.

Upon arrival, trained Carrefour francophone and TNO employees will direct the audience members to the designated reception area. An employee will conduct a safe and respectful health check survey* (See health screening procedures section). Audience members will then be directed to a designated area, where they will remain for the entire show.

It will be forbidden to eat or drink during the performance. All audience members must have a non-surgical mask with them upon entering the performance site. Disposable non-surgical masks will be available for those who do not have one. A hand-sanitizing station will also be available at reception.

Layout of the outdoor space and physical distancing

Audience members must remain at least two metres away from anyone who is not part of their social bubble. To enforce that, the space designated for the audience will be divided with markings on the ground so that there will always be at least two metres between individuals or few people from the same group. The performance area will be at least three metres from the audience area. All singing performances will take place behind a plexiglass barrier, integrated to the set of the show.

A designated employee will be responsible for ensuring that the audience members respect all measures and remain in the space that will be designated to them.

Artists, technicians and organizers will always be at a distance of at least two metres from the audience members.

SAFETY MEASURES FOR ARTISTS

General provisions

Prior to the show, Carrefour francophone and TNO will share their Safety Measures with artists, who will have to agree to follow these measures by signing their contract.

At the beginning of every rehearsal and performance, artists will go through a COVID-19 screening (See health screening procedures section).

Layout of the outdoor space and physical distancing

During rehearsals and performances, which will all take place outside, artists must maintain physical distancing of two metres from every other person, except from other performers who are in their social bubble, or for absolute necessary purposes of the performance. **In the extraordinary case when physical distancing cannot be maintained, artists, technicians and organizers must wear a non-surgical mask.**

The performance area will be at least three metres from the audience area and the performers must stay at a distance from the audience members at all times. All singing performances will take place behind a plexiglass barrier, integrated to the set of the show.

The set of the show will be sanitized between each performance, by a designated employee, who will also be responsible for ensuring that the artists respect all measures and remain in the area designated for them.

HEALTH SCREENING PROCEDURES

Health screening is an essential step to help reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19. Everyone must be screened before entering the site of the performance. A screening policy outlining steps to be taken and a screening form will be provided to all staff and are to be used.

Screening procedure

- All employees will be trained in health screening and will maintain a distance of at least two metres or six feet between staff members administering the screening and those being screened.
- Health screening personnel will be provided with masks and hand sanitizer. Employees must wear a surgical mask when screening where it is impossible to maintain a good physical distance and no protective barrier is provided.
- Health screening personnel must perform good hand hygiene at all times. Hand sanitizer will be provided.
- Staff will ensure that Public Health Sudbury & Districts resources are available to anyone who fails the health screening.
- Anyone wishing to enter the performance site must be screened. Staff must follow the screening procedure for each person and must record the results (pass or fail).

-Le Carrefour francophone and Le TNO will report any suspected or confirmed cases of COVID-19 to Public Health Sudbury & Districts.

Hand sanitizer will be available at the performance site's entrance.

Screening questions for anyone entering the performance site

1. Have you had close contact with a person with an acute respiratory illness when you weren't wearing personal protective equipment?
2. Have you travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days?
3. Have you been diagnosed with COVID-19 or have you had close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 while you weren't wearing personal protective equipment?
4. Do you or any other member of your household have any of the following symptoms (whether new or worsening):
 - a fever (temperature of 37.8°C or higher);
 - a new or worsening cough;
 - shortness of breath;
 - a sore throat;
 - difficulty swallowing;
 - a decrease or loss of the perception of taste or smell;
 - nasal congestion or runny nose with no other known cause;
 - (in young children) lethargy or loss of appetite (in the absence of any other diagnosis).
5. Do you have any of the following atypical symptoms (new or worsening):
 - unexplained fatigue, malaise or muscle pain;
 - delirium (profoundly altered mental state and inattention);
 - unexplained or increased falls;
 - chills;
 - headaches;
 - conjunctivitis.

Responses and actions to be taken:

- If a person answers NO to all the screening questions, they have passed the screening and can enter the site.
- If a person answers YES to any screening question or refuses to answer, they have failed the screening and therefore cannot enter the site.
- The list of all people that participated in the screening test will be documented and will be kept on file by the organizations.
